# NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON TAX INCREASE

A tax rate of \$ .5517 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of City of Henderson.

PROPOSED TAX RATE	\$ <u>.5517</u>	per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2021 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for City of Henderson from the same properties in both the 2020 tax year and the 2021 tax year.

The voter-approval rate is the highest tax rate that City of Henderson may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.
